

Celebrating Student Excellence: A Holistic Approach to Awards and Recognition

At Henry Park, we believe in nurturing the full potential of each student through a holistic approach to education. This commitment is reflected in our awards and recognition programs, which celebrate excellence across academic, co-curricular, leadership, social emotional and character development domains.

Our students are encouraged to strive for well-rounded achievement. These honors recognise their performance and fosters a culture of continuous improvement and lifelong learning.

Through this multi-tiered system of awards, we aim to cultivate a community of passionate learners, servant leaders, and responsible citizens - individuals who will go on to make a positive impact on the communities and world around them.

(A) Ministry of Education (MOE) Edusave Awards

Annually, MOE recognises Singaporean students who have performed well, made good progress in school work and displayed good conduct in school. The awards are categorised into academic and non-academic awards:

(B) School Based Awards

The school recognises students for their achievements in both academic and non-academic areas during the “HPPS Celebrates!” annual awards ceremony.

The Character Award is given to students who consistently display positive behaviours and attitudes that are important for lifelong learning. There are also awards such as Top Performers Awards and Outstanding Primary 6 Student of the Year Award.

In addition, we will recognise students who are Top in each subject across the level (for P5 and P6 only) by listing their names on our school website. Please take note that there will be no physical awards presented for Top in Subject across the level.

(C) Class Based Awards

At the class level, students are recognised for their contributions made and displaying positive attributes each year. The class Form Teachers nominate these students in consultation and with consensus with their class students and subject teachers. These awards are presented to the selected students during the Children’s Day celebrations.
